

What do I need to file my taxes?

The documents you need for tax prep depends on your situation. To help you prepare for your tax appointment or walk in, we've created a checklist to help you know what forms to bring

PERSONAL INFORMATION	All taxpayers will need the following to do their taxes:		
		Social security card or tax ID number;	
		Your spouse's social security card or tax ID Number;	
	\Box	Identity Protection PIN (IP PIN), if one has been issued to you, or your dependent by the IRS;	
	\Box	Routing and account numbers to receive your refund by direct deposit.	
		Marriage Certificate if it is your first time filing jointly with our office;	
		Foreign reporting and residency information - if applicable	
DEPENDENT INFORMATION	Parents and	d caregivers should gather this information as we need this information every year.	
		Social Security Cards for each dependent	
		Birth Certificates for each dependent	
		If you are claiming a dependent who is not your son or daughter, you must provide additional birth certificates to verify your relationship to the child. For example, if you are claiming your	
		nephew, you will need to submit your nephew's birth certificate, your sibling's (brother or sister)	
		birth certificate, and your own birth certificate to establish the family connection.	
		Proof of Residency Documentation	
		In order to ensure compliance with IRS regulations, we kindly request that you provide	
		documentation that satisfies ALL four of the following conditions:	
		1) Taxpayer's Name	
		2) Dependent's Name	
		3) Matching Address	
		4) Date for Applicable Tax Year (must show at least the last 6 months of year)	
		Our office will NOT transmit returns without the necessary dependent documentation, as outlined	
		by Form 886-H-DEP and other relevant IRS publications. Below are some examples:	
		School Records (Student Demographics) - Current School Year	
		Social Service Records (SNAP Benefits, WIC, etc).	
		Medical Records (We cannot accept Immunizations Records)	
		Healthcare Provider Statement (Medicaid, Private Insurance, etc.)	
		Daycare Records (Must be on official letterhead)	
		Landlord/Property Manager Statement (Must be on official letterhead).	
		Place of Worship Statement (Must be on official letterhead).	
		Indian Tribal Official Statement	
		Address Verification from Chapter House	
		Employer Statement (Must be on official letterhead).	
		Childcare/Daycare records if applicable	
		Income of dependents and of other adults in your home if applicable.	
		Form 8332 showing that the child's custodial parent is releasing their right to claim a child to you.

	Fees paid to a licensed day care center or family day care for care of an infant or preschooler Amounts paid to a baby-sitter or provider care of your child under age 13 while you work Expenses paid through a dependent care flexible spending account at work
